

We see captain, engineers, and crew fight for their lives, and hear their actual words (as recorded on the ship ’ s black box) while the hurricane relentlessly tightens its noose around the ship. We watch, minute by minute, all that is happening on board—the ship ’ s mysterious tilt to one side, worried calls to the engine room, ship-to-shore reports, the courage of the men and women as they fight to survive, and the berserk ocean ’ s

savage consumption of the massive hull. And through it all, the pain and ultimate resilience of the families of El Faro ' s crew. Now with a new afterword, this “ tour de force of nautical expertise ” (Ocean Navigator) is a masterwork of stunning power.
